

# **Ed Klimek**

With the legendary Phil Rizzuto as his great-uncle, being a Yankee fan and a baseball fan was inevitable for Ed Klimek. Growing up in Clifton, New Jersey, Ed played football, basketball and baseball at Clifton HS where he garnered All-County and All-State honors in football and baseball on his way to selection in the school's Hall of Fame. Upon graduation, Ed attended Lafayette College on a football scholarship. After the untimely death of his mother during his sophomore year he transferred to Montclair State College to play baseball and started his coaching career.

After graduating from Montclair, Ed was hired to teach and coach at Teaneck HS in the fall of 1992. He coached football for 20 years as the team's defensive coordinator and coached future NFL stars Tamba Hali and Lance Ball. But baseball was his calling - after 2 years as an assistant coach at Clifton HS, Ed was hired as the head baseball coach at Teaneck HS, a position he held for 30 years.

Ed won over 300 games during his career at Teaneck and his teams qualified for the state tournament 12 times and the county tournament 6 during his tenure. His best team in 1999 went 24-7 and made it to the county semifinals and the state sectional final. He also sent over 50 players on to college to continue their careers.

"Baseball and coaching has made me the person that I am today," Ed recently said. "There have been many wins and losses throughout the years, but the lessons taught and learned are the most important thing. The relationships that were formed will never be forgotten."

Coach Klimek's 3 children, Carly, Sean and Nicole, have a combined 33 varsity letters and have made numerous all-county and all-league teams. All 3 have a ball in the school's showcase - Carly for 1000 points in basketball, Sean for being the school's all-time leading rusher in football and Nicole for 500 digs in volleyball and 100 hits in softball.

Ed could never have done this without his lovely wife, Christine. They have been happily married for 26 years. It takes a special person to be the wife of a coach.

Teaneck is the only real job Ed has ever had. After teaching and coaching for 30 years he put away his whistle and fungo and became the Athletic Director at THS. This year's baseball program will be sending 7 seniors on to play in college. Even though this wasn't "his team", they were still "his guys."

Ed cherishes all the relationships he has developed over the years with other coaches, umpires and players. Ed would like to thank the tournament committee for selecting him for this very special award.

## **Carcich/Butler Championship Plaque**

Today's championship plaque is named after two of the most influential men in Bergen County Baseball Tournament history. Bob Carcich and Greg Butler, in tandem for 32 years from 1988 to 2019, as Chairman and Bergen County Coaches Association liaison, respectively, evolved the tournament into one of not the most prestigious county tournament in the State of New Jersey. Their integrity and attention to detail has made the annual affair a perennial goal for every Bergen County school.

Bob Carcich was the head baseball coach at Emerson High School for 28 years, amassing 539 wins and qualifying for the tournament in 26 of those 28 seasons, a truly remarkable accomplishment for a small Group 1 school. He led the Cavos to 28 straight winning season that included 14 league championships, 7 state sectional titles and three Group 1 state championships. A three-time Bergen County Coach of the Year, he was a Baldwin-Hunt recipient in 2002. Carcich is a member of the Emerson High School Hal of Fame and the New Jersey State Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Greg Butler spent a combined 19 seasons as a head baseball coach at Bergenfield, Northern Valley Demarest and Don Bosco, compiling 361 wins along with 8 league championships, 4 Bergen County titles, two sectional titles and state championships with Demarest (1999) and Don Bosco (2008, a 33-0 group that finished as the topranked team in the country). A four-time Bergen County Coach of the Year and the 2001 Baldwin-Hunt recipient, he has also served as the President of the Bergen County Coaches Association in 1992 and is presently serving as tournament director for the NJSIAA state baseball tournament.

#### **Peter Amoruso Umpire Service Award**

The BCCA Umpire Service Award is named after Peter Amoruso. Pete Amoruso began officiating football, basketball and baseball in 1971 and continued to officiate up to 2009 at the high school and college level. He had officiated 10 state high school baseball finals, 20 state high school football finals, four Bergen County basketball finals, two Passaic County basketball finals, six state basketball finals and one tournament of Champions final.
